

Singapore Environment Council appointed verifier and issuer of Green 100 Badges to support national SME sustainability transition

Singapore, 21 May 2026 — The Singapore Environment Council (SEC) is proud to be the **primary verifier and issuer for the Green 100 badge**.

As a member of the Council for a Competitive Climate Transition (C3T), SEC supports the Green 100 movement which looks to accelerate sustainability adoption across value chains by mobilising “Queen Bees” to engage their SME networks to obtain Green 100 badges (more information on Green 100 below). With 22 pioneering Queen Bees on board and over 30 SMEs participating in Green 100 validation sessions, there is growing momentum among businesses to strengthen environmental performance and competitiveness.

Building on SEC’s longstanding experience as Singapore’s national certification body and a UNEP-accredited organisation, SEC will play a central role in the movement by ensuring Green 100 badges are **credible, verifiable, and aligned with TR149**, a recently launched framework for organisations to assess maturity of sustainability practices and identify improvement pathways.

Additionally, a **Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) between SEC’s Eco Spaces certification programme and Green 100 badges** is also being finalised. Once implemented, it will enable businesses to progress seamlessly from foundational sustainability reporting to more advanced certification pathways. Through this MRA, the Eco Spaces certification and its tiering system will be aligned with TR 149 and recognised by Greenprint (Gprnt), the operator of the Green 100 scheme.

In support of the Green 100 initiative, SEC has also signed a **Memorandum of Understanding with the Sustainability Alliance** to expand SME participation and strengthen industry sustainability capabilities. By combining SEC’s sustainability verification expertise and 20 years of experience engaging SMEs through Eco-Certifications with SA’s extensive network of Trade Associations and SMEs, the partnership aims to accelerate outreach and onboarding efforts, with an aspirational target of onboarding up to 1,000 companies on the Green 100 platform.

SEC looks forward to the successful launch of the Green 100 initiative. As a trusted sustainability partner, SEC remains committed to supporting businesses at every stage of their sustainability journey and strengthening Singapore’s position as a leading green economy hub in the region.

Commenting on SEC’s role in the initiative, Ms Isabella Huang Loh, Chairman of the Singapore Environment Council, emphasised that:

Green 100 provides SMEs with a fast, simple and no-cost entry point into sustainability. SMEs complete basic sustainability disclosure to receive a digital Green 100 badge verified and issued by SEC. Four progressive badge tiers —Essential, Bronze, Silver, and Gold—recognise increasing levels of sustainability maturity. By obtaining these, companies gain access to the Green 100 Supplier Registry and Network, enhancing visibility and access to sustainability-linked opportunities, while benefiting from SEC's certification ecosystem that supports their progression towards Eco Spaces certification.
